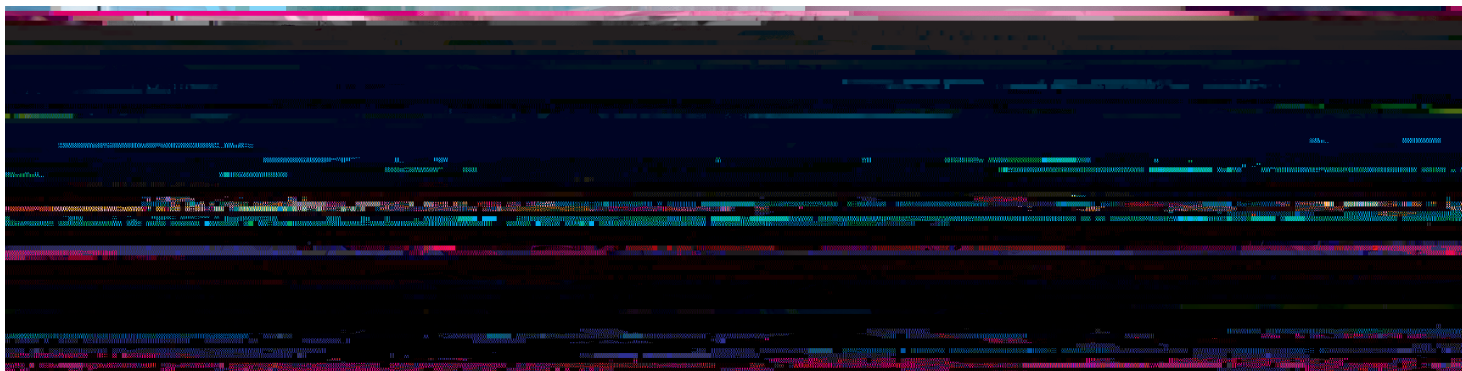


IRSC School of Nursing



The Indian River State College (IRSC) School of Nursing is the leader in nursing education in a region where, according to the 2019 Treasure Coast Skills Gap Study, employment in healthcare occupations is projected to grow 14 percent from 2018 to 2028, adding about 1.9 million new jobs. Programs go above and beyond the traditional learning experience by engaging students through cutting-edge technology in the classroom and interdisciplinary collaboration. As a result, student success rates regularly exceed state and national average for licensure.

The School of Nursing offers students multiple pathways to pursue careers in nursing—from fast-entry career training programs that lay the foundation for Home Health Aides and Nursing Assistants in 8-12 weeks to the Bachelor's Degree in Nursing (R.N. to B.S.N.) program.
